

Recording Equipment

Wolfville Memorial Library Innovation Lab (Media Makery) - Wolfville Memorial Library

Equipment for content creation purposes:

- 1 x JVC 4K Memory Card Camera Recorder
 - Used to shoot high quality video with a variety of audio inputs and video outputs, on either a tripod, shoulder-mount, or freehand, includes top-mounted microphone
- 1 x Nikon D7200 DSLR
 - Used to shoot high quality photography or record video, includes top-mounted flash and tripod, WiFi enabled
- 2 x LED studio lights
 - Controllable white/yellow output, with adjustable stands and the option between battery and adapter
- 1 x Backdrop kit
 - 5 piece set to hang a backdrop of choice, with black, white, and chroma key options
- 3 x Microphone stands
 - Can be used in a variety of positions, including overhead
- Various microphones
- Dynamic, condenser, and ribbon microphones are available for use, along with windscreens and XLR cables
- Video editing computer with various software including Adobe Premiere.
- Various headphones.
- Also we have a sound-isolated audio recording booth which can be used for music or voice overlays, connected via USB interfaces to computers with a variety of editing software.
- As well, we have a 65" Samsung Flip which may be used as a prompt, and is compatible with many devices.





Availability

Generally, our equipment can be used for free by the public **with a library card** during the open hours of the Wolfville Memorial Library Innovation Lab. The schedule for open hours can be found on the Annapolis Valley Regional Library website and is updated monthly.

Agreements can be made to use this equipment at different times, including weekends. Please contact us if you are interested in using this equipment for a short term.

While it is evident that our facility may only offer space for a few people at a time, we are unable to accommodate the use of our equipment outside our facilities.

It is expected that this equipment is treated with care and respect, as it is free to use. While we can train the basics of our equipment to new users, former experience will allow a higher production quality.
